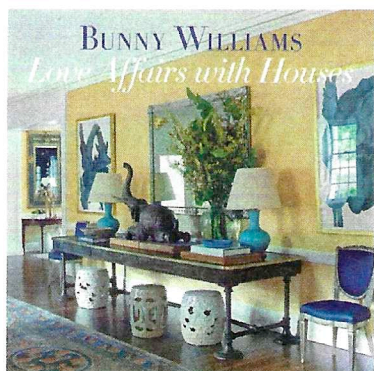
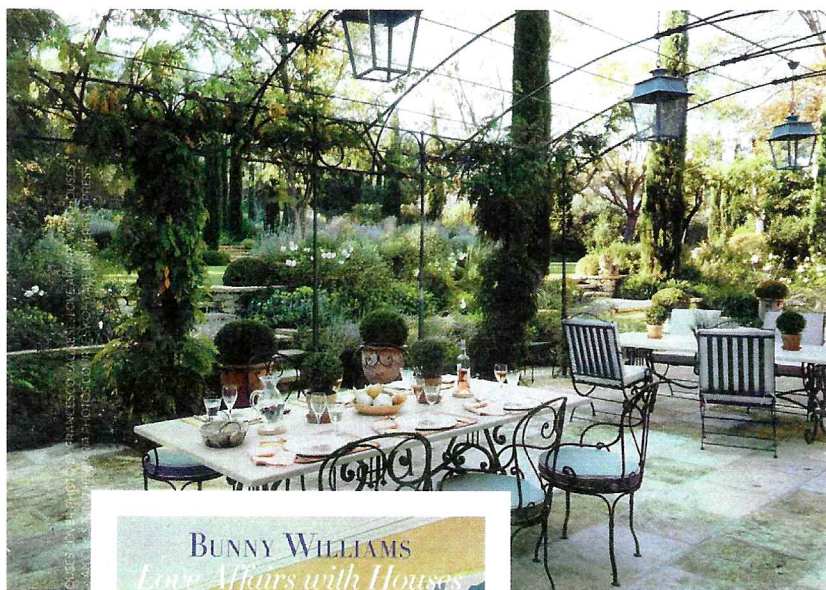
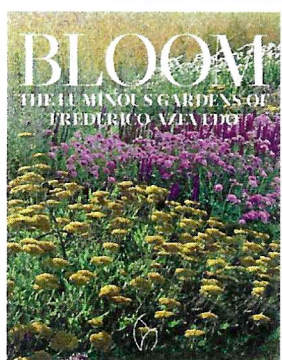

BLOOM: THE LUMINOUS GARDENS OF FEDERICO AZEVEDO

As North Haven-based landscape designer and owner of Unlimited Earth Care, Frederico Azevedo has been creating gorgeous gardens in the Hamptons for 28 years. The most spectacularly verdant are now evergreen, in shelf-life terms, in his first book, out this month. *Bloom: The Luminous Gardens of Frederico Azevedo* (\$75, Pointed Leaf Press) features the local talent's most picturesque properties while exploring the hallmarks of his gardens: curving, floral borders; integration of native plants; dramatic, multidimensional vistas; and a repetition of color, texture and shape.

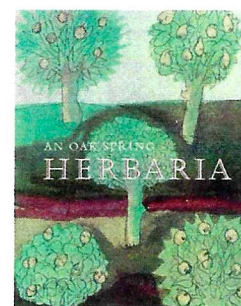


LOVE AFFAIRS WITH HOUSES

Bunny Williams, perhaps America's most famous decorator, releases her seventh monograph this month. Her new book, *Love Affairs With Houses* (\$60, Abrams), traces the "affairs" she's had with 15 recent projects, including Hollyhock in Southampton, which is featured in this issue. As Williams tells it, "The best pieces have the best stories." And in this story-filled tome, she demonstrates just that.

AN OAK SPRING HERBARIA

This month, Yale University Press releases *An Oak Spring Herbaria* (\$80, osgf.org), a 400-page compendium originally compiled by the late gardening icon Rachel "Bunny" Lambert Mellon. Famous for redecorating the White House with Jackie Kennedy and designing its rose garden, Mellon left a lifelong collection of rare gardening books at her home in Upperville, Va., to the public. Now, the foundation is printing them in hope of inspiring the nation's next great horticulturists.
